

Official Rules Intel Berkeley Technology Entrepreneur Challenge People's Choice Award – 2010

The Intel Berkeley Technology Entrepreneur Challenge (IBTEC) People's Choice Awards for 2010 allows the public to vote for their favorite team from those who have agreed to enter their projects in the People's Choice Awards. These Official Rules for the IBTEC People's Choice Awards (the "Rules") govern the role of participation. The results and voting in the IBTEC People's Choice Award have no influence, bearing or consideration on the results of judging for other awards at IBTEC.

- 1. Who is Eligible to Participate: All of the 2010 IBTEC Teams that participated in the program at the University of California Berkeley. and who have agreed to participate in the IBTEC People's Choice Awards.
- 2. People's Choice Award and Voting: Beginning November 18th, 2010, the contestants who have agreed to participate in the IBTEC People's Choice Awards will be featured at www.inspiredbyeducation.com. The website will include a biography, company description, and team picture. Visitors to the website will be encouraged to vote on their favorite team using the voting buttons provided on the website. Voting begins on November 18th, 2010. Voting will end on December 6th, 2010 at 12 pm EST. After this time no more votes will be accepted.
- 3. People's Choice Winners: The Finalists that receive the most votes will be spotlighted on the award website. Votes will be tallied electronically.
- 4. **Prize**: The Winner will be notified via email on December 7th, 2010. The prize will be mailed to the winner after the contest results are announced. [Total value \$5,000 US)]
- 5. **Voting criteria**: Voters should vote for the team whose project they feel is most creative, innovative, and has the most potential to succeed as a business venture as well as have a positive impact on society.
